BAUMIT Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") issues this PPWR Declaration of Conformity in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2025/40 of the European Parliament and of the Council on Packaging and Packaging Waste (Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation – PPWR), taking into account all relevant European Union legislation.

Based on the documentation available to us, we hereby declare that the packaging of products manufactured and placed on the market by the Company complies with the requirements of the PPWR applicable to the respective packaging at the time it is placed on the market.

This declaration particularly covers the following main packaging material groups:

- Construction bags (Paper or Paper/PE hybrid)
- Corrugated cardboard boxes (Paper)
- Wooden pallets (Wood – EUR / EPAL)
- Underlay film (Plastic – PE-LD)
- Flat film (Plastic – PE-LD)
- Stretch hood film (Plastic – LDPE)
- Shrink film (Plastic – LDPE)
- Buckets and bucket lids (Plastic – Polypropylene)
- Labels (Paper)
- Adhesives
- Big Bags (Plastic – Polypropylene)

This declaration is based on our internal conformity assessment, as well as on declarations of conformity, technical data sheets, and other supporting documentation provided by our suppliers.

PPWR Compliance Assessment

Article 5 PPWR – Requirements for Substances in Packaging

Based on supplier declarations, the packaging complies, to the best of our current knowledge, with Article 5 of the PPWR and with the requirements of the REACH Regulation. The packaging does not contain intentionally added PFAS substances, and the concentrations of heavy metals and SVHCs (Substances of Very High Concern) remain below the applicable legal limits. As the packaging is not intended for food contact, specific food-contact material (FCM) regulations are not applicable.

Article 6 PPWR – Recyclable Packaging

Based on the available composition data and supplier documentation, the design of the packaging components supports material recycling. Once becoming waste, the individual packaging elements can be separately collected and

directed to the appropriate waste streams. Compliance is demonstrated through supplier declarations, material composition data, and internal packaging and quality-control requirements.

Article 7 PPWR – Minimum Recycled Content (PCR)

The mandatory minimum recycled content requirements for plastic packaging become applicable from 1 January 2030. Based on the available documentation, the current packaging system complies with the transitional requirements currently in force.

Article 8 PPWR – Bio-Based Plastics

The packaging does not contain bio-based plastics as defined in Article 3(1), point 53 of the PPWR. Therefore, the requirements of Article 8 are not applicable.

Article 9 PPWR – Compostable Packaging

The packaging materials used are not compostable. Therefore, the requirements of Article 9 are not applicable to this packaging system.

Article 10 PPWR – Packaging Minimisation

The mass and volume of the packaging are limited to the minimum necessary to ensure product protection, pallet stability, and safe transportation. The packaging system does not contain misleading or unnecessary volume-increasing elements.

Article 11 PPWR – Reusable Packaging

Within the packaging system, wooden pallets comply, based on supplier declarations, with the reusability requirements set out in Article 11(1) and Article 29(1)-(3) of the PPWR. Other packaging elements within the system (films, bags, and buckets) are not reusable.

Article 12 PPWR – Packaging Labelling

The current markings and labels applied to the packaging clearly support material identification and separate collection. The Company continuously monitors future harmonised EU labelling requirements through its internal quality-management processes and will implement any necessary changes when required.

This document serves as a corporate summary declaration of conformity addressed to the Company's customers, business partners, and competent authorities, providing uniform evidence of the documented assessment of conformity relating to the raw materials and auxiliary materials used.

This declaration is based on the Company's consolidated assessment of supplier documentation available at the time of issue. Supporting documentation is retained electronically by the Company and may be presented or provided upon justified customer or authority request, subject to applicable legal requirements and the protection of confidential business information.

This declaration has been issued exclusively on the basis of information, supplier declarations, technical documentation, and internal conformity assessments available at the date of issue. The conformity assessment shall be interpreted with regard to the applicable dates of application of the relevant PPWR provisions and the legal requirements in force at the respective time. Should the applicable legal framework, regulatory interpretation, supplier information, or the composition of the packaging materials used change, the Company reserves the right to review and amend this declaration as necessary.
